## Language Arts

This month our class will be introduced to reading strategies that can strengthen our comprehension of text. Your child will practice using the strategies of predicting and drawing conclusions. Students will also work on the skills of recognizing the author's intent for the text, main idea and supportive details, sequencing text, and cause/effect relationships.

Our class will also learn about the purpose of the dictionary and its components such as entry words and guide words. Mastering alphabetical order will be extremely beneficial for your child.

In the area of writing we are practicing how to write complete sentences that will compile into a descriptive narrative paragraph. The study of adjectives in class and out will help your child write more vividly as we practice throughout the month.

Nightly word study will be differentiated, so students will have different words based on the spelling group they are assigned. Please see that your child completes word study.
